# A Message from Pastor Bill

Grace and peace to you from him who is, and who was, and who is to come, and from the seven spirits before his throne, Revelation 1:4b

Hello Friends:

The family Christmas gathering ended. Had we been to Christmas worship service or just opening presents? It was so long ago. Something I do remember from that night is still alive. I was sitting in a chair. It was well after midnight. There was a scrubby little Christmas tree glowing across the room, but I was all alone with my thoughts. Well not quite. ### Greetings from the Renovation committee...Ron Snowberger

Exciting things are being planned to expand our church, which will bring the building up to date and improve the overall comfort and operational function of the facility as we continue to grow and serve God.

The renovation committee has spent the past several months meeting with the hired architect/engineering firm, Local Engineering Inc. (LEI) to have as built plans and conceptual ideas developed for renovations. These plans and ideas were sent to the Citrus County Building Department and the Fire Marshal's office for review. We have discovered, that "any" renovations to the facility will require the building to be brought up to current fire and building code regulations and requirements.

At this time, the renovation committee has gained approval from the Board of Trustees and will seek the approval of the Administrative Board on January 8<sup>th</sup> 2025 to continue having LEI to prepare the "design plans" for the renovations inclusive of all required code compliance needs. During 2025, the committee hopes to further update the congregation by presenting the plans and projected costs that would include, but not be limited to following "new" areas.

- Sanctuary expansion
- More welcoming foyer and entryway to sanctuary
- New restroom facilities
- Kitchen expansion
- Expansion of fellowship hall
- Addition of ample office space
- A defined Children's ministry area
- Choir storage

The committee looks forward to see where the Lord will lead us and the congregation in 2025.

# THE WAYS OF THE KINGDOM ... Jan Wise

It is the beginning of a new year, the start of something different, the challenge of making 2025 the best year ever. There is something about a "new" year that stimulates us to assess our way of life, both individually and as a nation.

We hear negative assessments from the mouths of those who feel our country is going the wrong way--away from greatness, the respect and the role of being the leader on the world stage. After each school shooting, we hear, "This is not who we are; this is not the kind of thing that happens in our country". But it does. With each tragedy, our composure based on the ideal of the American way of life gets a little more frayed. Who are we, abiding in a country whose reputation as "Christian" has long been shattered?

I would like to urge a new way of thinking in 2025. In Psalm 50, written to Asaph, a leader of the Temple choir, God testifies against those of his chosen people who have strayed from his ways. How would he speak to us who get caught up in the frenzy of the uncertain scene around us, and begin thinking contrary to what our Lord teaches, resulting in an irrational fear of what is happening in our country. We forget the reliability of the teachings of God and fall back on our human wisdom and fleshly behavior.

God ends his words against the back-sliding people of Israel with these frightening words: "Consider this, you who forget God, or I will tear you to pieces, with no one to rescue: **He who sacrifices thank offerings honors me, and he prepares the way so that I may show him the salvation of God. (Ps.50:23)** So, as God always does, he offers his way of escape for those who recognize the danger of our situation.

Are we ready to thank God for the outcome of the recent election, knowing the Bible says God is the One who raises up and brings down those in authority over us? Are we willing to thank God for the riots, the evidence of decline in the godly focus of our country's leaders? In it all, are we ready to praise our God who allows situations that frighten us?

What happens when a favorite antique vase drops on the floor and shatters? Or a fisherman loses his best lure? Or a loved one dies expectedly? Can we learn to offer the **sacrifice of thanksgiving** to the One who is over every detail of our lives? God promises that through **every** sacrifice of thanksgiving, he will show us his salvation, a blessing to

anticipate. Can we say, no matter how hard or seemingly unfair the situation, "I thank you for this, Lord, and look for your salvation."?

In the Old Testament, there is a book written by the prophet Habakkuk. He tells of the Israelites living life their own way, neglecting the teachings of God. So, he asks God what he will do to the people of Judah for their disobedience.

God tells him the Babylonians, an ungodly nation, will attack and punish the disobedient Israelites. Then Habakkuk asks how God could send a godless nation to punish a nation of believers in God. God explains that after he uses the Babylonians to punish the wayward Israelites, he will then punish the nation of Babylon.

Although God's plans for Judah left Habakkuk terrified of the future, he made a predetermined decision to rejoice in the Lord no matter how bad things might get. He said, "Though the fig tree does not bud and there are no grapes on the vines, though the olive crop fails, and the fields produce no food, though there are no sheep in the pen and no cattle in the stalls, yet I will rejoice in the Lord, I will be joyful in God my Savior. Then Habakkuk proclaims, "The Sovereign Lord is my strength; he makes my feet like the feet of a deer, he enables me to go on the heights". (Hab. 3:17-19)

Can we do that--rejoice, offer thanksgiving to our God, no matter how bad things may get? The world is in turmoil; our nation is in turmoil. But God knows exactly what he is doing, so we, too, can make a pre-determined decision to offer our sacrificial thank offerings, to rejoice in our God...no matter what happens.
