

# Ways of the Kingdom.....Jan Wise

I asked the Lord, "What shall I write? This column is due tomorrow! He said, "Write what you know". So, this I know: Jesus said, "Remain in me and I will remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in me. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me. I am the vine; you are the branches. If a man remains in me and I in him, he will bear much fruit. Apart from me you can do nothing".

Keeping God, especially his Son Jesus, as the central focus of my life in all situations--whether I am having a restless night, getting supper, doing the wash, or just "pondering" the events of the day, my mind keeps circling back to God's presence in what is occurring or has happened.

Remember he said he would never, never, never leave us. So, He is there always, a part of whatever the circumstances...I know that, too.

Now think about this amazing promise: Then Jesus said, "If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish and it will be given you. This is to my Father's glory that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples." (John 15:4-5, 7)

So, if our little church continues to stay steadfast in the ways of the Lord, giving God the glory as we grow in faith and move out in trust, we may ask for what-ever the Holy Spirit leads us to request.

We find a serious warning in James 4:1-3: "What causes fights and quarrels among you? Don't they come from your desires that battle within you? You want something, but don't get it. You kill and covet, but you cannot have what you want. You quarrel and fight. You do not have because you do not ask God. When you do ask, you do not receive, because you ask with wrong motives, that you may spend what you get on your pleasures.

One man gave our pastor a very large check as a gift for the church. God moved on the heart of a person in the church with the thought, "I can do more than that". That person asked the Bible-study members to pray about asking God for a "mortgage-free church". They prayed individually and came back together with solid agreement—we were to ask God for the funds. The idea was presented to each of the pastors, and from there on the idea resided in the hands of the church leadership. Through believing prayer, hard work, trusting God for what seemed an unreachable goal (to us, not to God!), we now are worshiping in the miracle of a mortgage-free church.

It is up to us to avoid the pitfalls of James 4. We are to ask God with united, trusting hearts when we have a need. He loves to give and wants to bless us with the joy of receiving!
