A Message from Pastor Kip

"Well, that should do it!" I thought to myself, "No one will ever find it here!" And as far as I know, no one has found it yet. Not even me.

We were getting ready to go out of town, and as is my custom, I hid my check book just in case some bad guys decide to break into our house while we were away. I always make sure to put it somewhere that a thief would never look. Maybe in the pocket of a pair of pants hanging in the closet. Or tapped to the bottom of a heavy piece of furniture. Or maybe between the box springs and one of the boards that support the box springs.

I had noticed that it was missing from where I usually keep it, but I didn't really think too much about that. I knew it had to be somewhere, and eventually I would find it easy enough. Then as weeks passed, it began to trouble me that I hadn't accidentally stumbled across it. And of course, it wasn't just the check book. In it, I believe, was a paycheck from the church and some cash. When Wanda asked me why I hadn't deposited that particular check, I had to try and remember even getting one for that month. I waited another week or so, and I never found the check. It must be hiding with the check book. Maybe they were all hiding in my car or the truck. You know they like to hide under the seats or between the front seats and the center console. Maybe I was really on my way to the bank and lost them all at the same time. But I never take the check book to the bank.

Now I was getting nervous. I searched all my hiding places that the thief will never find and I found nothing. I went through all my hanging clothes. I went through all my folded clothes in my dresser. I looked in all my shoes in the closet. I even looked in my tie bag, and still nothing! Where had my check book, check, and cash run off to?

There had been no checks written from my account, so I had to assume that no one had found it and tried to clean out my account. After another week or so, I went to the bank and explained my predicament. The lady at the bank had apparently heard this tale before. She was not surprised and knew exactly what to do about it. In no time at all I left with a new checking account and the promise of checks coming in the mail soon. Great.

I cannot tell you how much this missing checkbook irked me. I looked everywhere! I tore the house apart searching. I prayed repeatedly, repeatedly, and then prayed more just in case God didn't catch the first few hundred prayers. Nothing! I KNOW He knows exactly where it is! He can see it clearly. Yet God says not one word as to where to go and retrieve it. Nothing!

In the Gospel of Matthew, 6:19-20, Jesus tells the people the following warning: **19** "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moths and vermin destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. **20** But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moths and vermin do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal."

I couldn't begin to count the number of hours I have spent searching, praying and pondering over this missing "treasure". And still, nothing! Is there a message here somewhere? My guess is; "Probably so." My account was not tampered with and one trip to the bank established a new account with no loss of funds. The missing paycheck was canceled and a new one issued. The cash? Well, that's gone. It should have been in the bank months prior anyway. I was trying to imagine what the outcome of spending an equal amount of "searching time" in prayer would have accomplished? Well, I will never know. So, I learned my lesson about hiding treasures. And I was also reminded about seeking and storing up treasures in heaven at least to the equivalence of time that I wasted in time spent searching. And yes, I KNOW that God knows exactly where everything is! And He's not ready to talk about just yet - if ever.

Faith Community Nurse (FCN)...Karen Kline

What exactly is a Faith Community Nurse (FCN)? Is it the same as a Parish Nurse? Well, I'll explain. Parish Nursing was recognized as a nursing specialty practice in 1997 by the American Nursing Association (ANA). In 2025 the title was changed to Faith Community Nurse to encompass the scope of other denominations. Defined by the "Faith Community Scope and Standards of Practice": "Faith community nursing is a specialized professional nursing that focuses on the intentional care of the spirit as well as the promotion of whole-person health and the prevention or minimalization of illness within the context of a Faith Community and the wider community."

Faith community Nurse...continued

According to the 2017 ANA Scope and Standards of Practice the preferred minimal preparation for entry into Faith Community Nursing is:

*Baccalaureate or higher degree in nursing (BSN)

*Current experience as an RN using the nursing process

*Knowledge of the community's healthcare assets and resources

*Knowledge of the faith community spiritual beliefs and practices

What exactly does an FCN do? Well, first you do a health assessment of the faith community to assess health needs. You then provide education and resources, promote health, prevent illness and care for the spirit. You also provide spiritual care thru prayer and listening, do home and hospital visits as needed and be a support group facilitator. FCNs are licensed registered nurses who work with faith community leaders and community agencies.

In our area we are very blessed to be covered by the BayCare Health system. Their territory stretches from Citrus County down thru the Tampa Bay Area. I am connected to BayCare thru the Morton Plant Hospital and completed a 36 contact-hour course in "Foundations of Faith Community Nursing" thru them. Grace Methodist Church has contracted with BayCare for me as your FCN. BayCare also offers continued support through continuing education and resource assistance. Some FCNs are paid employees as I was at my previous church, and others are volunteers as I currently am with GMC.
