When I came back, Tom asked, "Where did you go in such a hurry"? "I'm in a hurry to get this wash done, I replied." So, I skipped the rest in between cycles and just moved it from wash to spin to hurry it along.

Tom gave me this horrified look, and I knew a lecture of some sort was coming--probably based on the mechanics of the washing machine. "Don't you know", he began, "your washing machine is designed to need pause times between cycles? If you keep pushing it to break that pattern, it will break down because of the stress on its system."

I heard what Tom was saying, but my teacher's mind had jumped to God's command regarding the way he had created our human bodies with a planned rest time to keep us from breaking down.

"Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy. Six days you shall labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the Lord your God. On it you shall not do any work, neither you or your son or daughter, nor your manservant or your maidservant, nor your animals nor the alien within your gates. For in six days the Lord made the heavens and the earth, the sea and all that is in them, but he rested on the seventh. Therefore, the Lord blesses the seventh day and made it holy." (Exodus 20:8-11)

Although we are no longer under the letter of the law because Jesus fulfilled it all, he cautions that the Law still exists and if we are careful to submit to his leading, we will fulfill the spirit of the Law in our daily walk.

Thinking about the times I have pushed to get one more thing done in an hour or in the day, I wonder if that's not a violation of the spirit of the law. How many times have I not listened to the Holy Spirit urging me to slow down or to give up a project that's stressing me and wearing my body out? And when I look at Sunday as a day (after church, of course) to get extra things done I meant to do during the week, am I not violating the Sabbath day of rest established by God for my good?

Jesus offers us rest, "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light". (Matthew 11:28-30) Let's remember to respond to his invitation during the busy holiday season.
