MESSAGE FROM PASTOR KIP

The air was cool on the Withlacoochee Trail because it was well shaded. Before me lay a downhill run that seemed to run on forever! My bike started its downhill descent. I could feel the speed climbing upwards as quickly as the bike jetted downward. Half down the descent I could see it clearly, a very small flat section of the Trail. Just beyond this small section came the sudden upward turning of the Trail. When checking my Cycling App at the end of the ride, it would reveal my fastest speed as 21.8 mph! This speed was no doubt recorded during my downward flight. This speed on a three-wheel Catrike, was very exciting! Every little bump, twig, acorn or cluster of leaves sent a shuddering vibration through the rigid trike frame encouraging me to grip the hand controllers tighter than before. Yet this didn't last long. Immediately after entering the bottom flat section, the uphill climb started. Within seconds, the bike began to slow down, and I had to start downshifting into lower gears. The downshifting generated a faster pedal speed, with the same amount of leg energy necessary to maintain the climb. The bike continued to slow, and I continued to lower the gears and pedal faster to keep a decent pace. In this section of the Trail, between Floral City

and the Townsend State Park in Hernando County, both the inclining and the descending sections are gentle, yet extremely long. Thus, the opportunity for high speed and the struggle back up the hill. As I ride this route, it is on the incline, pedaling furiously to keep up some type of reasonable speed, I am reminded of how this experience is so much like life itself Life is filled with constant uphill climbs and downhill runs. In the ups and downs of life we are facing challenges, fears, anxiety and other taxing emotions. On the downhill runs, life is great! Not a care in the world! What could possibly go wrong? Hebrews 2:18 NLT offers us the wonderful assurance of Jesus. "Since he (Jesus) himself has gone through suffering and testing, he is able to help us when we are being tested." If anyone knows about the "uphill climbs", it is Jesus. If I recall, it seems he hauled a cross on a severe "uphill" journey, just for you and I. John 16:33 NIV - "I have told you these things (his impending death and resurrection) so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." Troubles are the makings of that long arduous climb uphill. Faith in His overcoming the world fuels the downhill runs. It is in that small flat section between the ups and downs where we find that small space of normalcy. This is where life is good, and we are at peace. Where life is neither the racing excitement of the downhill run nor the dramatic unknown of the uphill climbs. This is where I seek to find the richness of life in Christ - in the peacefulness of the flats! I hope you do as well! Blessings, Pastor Kip

Have you ever gotten caught in a "what does this have to do with the Kingdom" situation?

I twisted the cover on the jar with all my "old lady" might, and the cover refused to move. In my head I started thinking, "What's wrong with these manufacturers! Don't they know that elderly people don't have the strength to open these "safety-sealed" jars? As my tongue prepared to voice my thoughts, I hesitated. This thought came to mind: "Walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh". Even with stubborn jar covers? Besides, I only intended to speak the truth about those inconsiderate manufacturers. "You were about to complain," came that still, small voice of the Holy Spirit's warning. "You mean I can't even voice a legitimate complaint?" my common-sense mind argued. So, I looked in my Bible and found Galatians 5:16-7. "So, I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh. For the flesh desires what is contrary to the Spirit, and the Spirit what is contrary to the flesh. They are in conflict with each other, so that you are not to do whatever you want".

I do admit I rather enjoy complaining, especially about things that aren't right or don't suit my idea of the way people or things should be. But a jar cover and in the privacy of my own home where no one would hear me But God was listening, or he wouldn't be talking to me like this.

The situation reminded me of the time I had an upset with the hangers in my clothes closet, away from everybody's view or hearing. Tangled hangers forced me (they really did) to lose my temper, and I threw them in a pile on the floor. As I looked at the twisted pile, I thought (didn't even say it aloud), "Sure glad my Bible study class didn't see that"! In my head, I heard a small, kind voice. "But I did. Remember, I never leave you nor forsake you". I was ashamed, embarrassed and repentant then, as I was now, looking at the resistant jar lid.

It's hard for me to stop complaining. It's a very bad habit that draws me away from walking in the Spirit, especially if I get in with a group who seem to thrive on complaining. These verses help me, "Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you". (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18) If I can learn to rejoice, pray continually and give thanks in ALL circumstances, complaining will have to go. I can learn, and so can you, because what the Word of God commands, the Spirit will enable you to do!

EMPATHY

OK, you just read about a world disaster. You feel bad, and maybe you'll pray for those affected or send a check to a relief fund. Is this empathy? No. This reaction would be defined

as sympathy. A definition of sympathy being: "Concern for someone else without becoming involved in their life". Having sympathy in situations like this is appropriate.

You just heard that your neighbor found her husband dead in the driveway after doing a lot of yard work. You rush to her crying and tell her you know how she feels, and that you just don't know how you are going to survive the loss of your friend. Is this empathy? No. This type of reaction is called "overidentification" and is defined as taking over another person's feelings where you are just as overwhelmed as the person. This type of reaction benefits no one.

So then, what is empathy and why are we seeing this term used more frequently, and what does it mean for all of us? The Merriam Webster definition is:" The ability to understand and share the feelings of another, being aware of, being sensitive to and vicariously experiencing the feelings of another". Another definition is the one taught in Stephen Ministry: "Feeling another person's feelings as if they were your own without actually taking them on yourself". Being empathetic has many benefits to both you and the person you are with. The person hurting feels understood, valued, believed, encouraged, accepted, cared for and not alone. For you, the person empathizing, you benefit by having deeper relationships, personal growth, more confidence, less pressure and great joy.

Being a nurse, Stephen Minister, Stephen Leader and Facilitator of Memory Lane I have seen my own benefits of empathy expand in my life. Pray that this gives you thoughts for prayer and how your life could benefit by expanding your own capacity for empathy.
